Please pray for the happy repose of three of our men who died since the last newsletter in August: RUSSELL 'POPEYE' BAUM, RANDY RAND, and DAN MEIER.

Popeye died in Oswego on September 25. He had been a resident at Morning Star Nursing Home since January 2013. Prior to being admitted to the Nursing Home, Popeye lived at the Acres pretty much continuously since January 1998. Although his eyesight was very poor, Popeye was for a long time one of the most dedicated of our night watchmen. We also remember his very keen sense of humor.

Randy Rand's tenure at the Acres went back to the early days in the 1970s. When he was a younger man Randy would help out especially in the Kitchen as a pot-washer back in the days when Helen Clark was the cook... In more recent years, Randy had settled in permanently, and in fact in a room just down the hall from Popeye's in the 'C' Building. During the last three or four years, Randy's health declined slowly; he was admitted to hospital at the end of the summer and died on October 27.

Both Randy and Popeye were buried at our St. Martin de Porres Cemetery.

Dan Meier died at the Acres on December 29. He had been living at Unity Acres since December 2008, but struggled increasingly for the last few years with an illness that proved to be terminal. Dan stayed in 'Sick Bay' after his illness progressed to a point where he required extra care. Dan's family in Fulton have arranged for his remains to be brought home to California for burial.

On a lighter note, Father Jones' celebrated his 80th birthday on October 23. The celebration began with Mass in our Sacred Heart Chapel, continued to include a meeting of the Acres' board of directors during the afternoon, and concluded with a dinner in his honor in the Star Building's dining room, which had been transformed for the evening with orange table cloths, flowers, balloons, and a birthday cake in the shape of a basketball. (Father is a big fan of SU basketball ...) We anticipate celebrating his 55th anniversary of ordination in a few more weeks, on February 2nd.

Loving Father, we at Unity Acres thank You for the many graces and gifts You have given us. Forgive any misuse of them, or taking them for granted. We pray that, as we dedicate this year 2015, to You, we live it wisely and well, joyfully, and with humor.
